FOOTNOTES TO APPENDIX II

- 1 Incomes in square brackets are based on inquisitions post mortem.
- 2 Where two amounts are shown this indicates the income of two members of the one family such as mother or father and son.
- 3 Those seised of freehold worth £5 and more per annum but who failed to appear before the tax commissioners (E179/240/269).
- 4 This is based on Elizabeth Bugge's income of £13 and assumes that her dower right amounted to one third of the family income.
- 5 Amice Chesilden was taxed in 1436 on her income of £31 (E179/192/59). A family income of £93 appears unlikely in this case.
- 6 In all calculations, Keble's income has been taken as £26. The 1436 tax return separately records £100 as income derived from Keble's position as feoffee of James Ormond (Butler).

Note: Most incomes have been drawn from the tax return for Leicestershire though, where necessary, the returns for neighbouring counties have also been consulted.

FOOTNOTES TO APPENDIX X

- 1 Specific references appear on the same line as individuals to which they relate. The earliest reference may also apply generally to the whole entry.
- 2 (K) denotes Knightly families.
- 3 The Brokesby family has been difficult to reconstruct so these conclusions must be regarded as tentative. Bartholomew Brokesby I died in 1448 without issue, his heir being his octogenarian brother, Edmund (C139/136/43 m.2; E149/186/20). Edmund cannot have survived for long but, in the absence of an inquisition post mortem we are unable to say when he died or, more important, the name of his heir. In 1453, Sir Leonard Hastings arranged for his daughter, Joan, to marry a John Brokesby son of Bartholomew (H.M.C. Hastings, i, 300-301). This Bartholomew must have been a nephew or great-nephew of Bartholomew I and Edmund. As Bartholomew II was not party to the agreement with Hastings, he must have been dead by 1453. He was possibly the same Bartholomew Brokesby of Frisby whose executors wished to found a chantry in Saxulby church in 1450 (L.A.O. Epis. Reg. XIX [Lumley] f.14) though this may have been a bequest of Bartholomew I. That Bartholomew II had a brother, William, is suggested by Wedgwood (Biographies, 114) and by the fact that in an enfeoffment of 1472, John Brokesby's heirs are given as first, his issue, then his illegitimate half-brother, William, and finally, Henry Brokesby, nephew of Bartholomew (II?) (Village Notes, ii, 262). John himself later had a son, Bartholomew, and a daughter (C141/5/13 m.2; PROB11/7/10/77v). The pedigree provided by Nichols (Nichols, iii, 406) fails to resolve the problems.
- 4 The arrangements for the marriage were made in 1464 when Elizabeth was three years old. The actual date of marriage is unknown but he was certainly married by 1480 when she was nineteen years old. (Plumpton Correspondence, p.lxxxviii). The agreement between Henry Sotehill and Sir William Plumpton envisaged a marriage when Elizabeth turned fourteen (ibid., p.lxxi).

FOOTNOTES TO APPENDIX XI

- ¹ Dr. Susan Wright follows Stemmata Shirleiana and gives Jane's husband as Richard Kniveton of Bradley (The Derbyshire Gentry in the Fifteenth Century, Derbyshire Record Society, vol. VIII, Chesterfield, 1983, p.217). However, a Sir William Brown petitioned the chancellor, William Archbishop of Canterbury, claiming that he had married "Johanne", daughter of John Shirley. "Johanne" was dead by the time of the petition but Brown's complaint was that her brother, Ralph, had failed to pay her marriage portion of 100 marks, allowed for in John Shirley's will (C1/289/48-52). The reference to William, Archbishop of Canterbury, dates Brown's appeal to the years 1504-15 (Handbook of British Chronology p.88). "Johanne" is a common variant of Jane and Sir Ralph's reply to Brown's bill of complaint also refers to the lady in question as "Jane", thereby countering any suspicion that Johanne and Jane were not the same person. As Ralph did not deny that there had been a marriage between his sister and Sir William Brown and as Brown would not have been entitled to the 100 marks had he been Jane's second husband, it seems that the claim in Stemmata Shirleiana of a marriage between Jane and Richard Kniveton is incorrect. Of course, the author of the Stemmata may have been privy to evidence which suggested an intention to marry Jane to Richard Kniveton, even though the marriage never took place. We should also keep in mind that, as a member of the Shirley family himself whose audience would include other members of his family, the author had a vested interest in not drawing attention to Sir Ralph Shirley's sordid accusations against the virtue of his dead sister (C1/289/52). One problem remains, however. Ralph refers to his sister's father-in-law, William Trussell. If we accept "father-in-law" in its usual sense this would preclude a marriage between Jane and either Richard Kniveton or Sir William Brown. We can only assume that Ralph had in mind some other form of relationship between Jane and Trussell the nature of which is elusive.
